CLEANING YOUR PRUNING TOOLS

- Pruning tools should be cleaned after <u>every cut</u>. This is usually difficult in practice, therefore, in the Kohan Garden, please at least be sure to clean tools between each shrub or tree.
- Clean all sap from tool blades with a solvent (Lighter fluid or WD-40) using a green scrubber or cloth. Use flammable materials outdoors. Clean the scrubbers with soap and water; air dry. Dispose of saturated paper towel safely. <u>Not in the tool shed</u>.
- 3. Wash soil or organic material off tool blades with soap and water using a scrubber.
- 4. Dry the tool with cloth or paper towel.
- 5. Saturate tool surfaces with Isopropyl Alcohol using a spray bottle or a clean material such as cloth or paper towel.
- A 5% solution of bleach and water may also be used as disinfectant but, this will corrode metal parts of your tools. If using bleach, after disinfecting for 5 minutes, rinse the tool, then apply a coating of WD-40.
